The Manufacturing, Engineering and Related Services Sector Education and Training Authority (merSETA) hereby invites relevant stakeholders to apply for discretionary grants for the 2024/25 Financial Year (3rd Funding Window). Only grant applications for training that is being implemented within the 2024/25 (01 April 2024 - 31 March 2025) financial year will be considered. This funding window aims to invite applications to address national and sector needs for the initiatives listed below:

Mandatory Compliance Documents

- Valid Tax Clearance Certificate – must not have expired.

Failure to submit any of the above-listed documents will result in the disqualification of the application.
